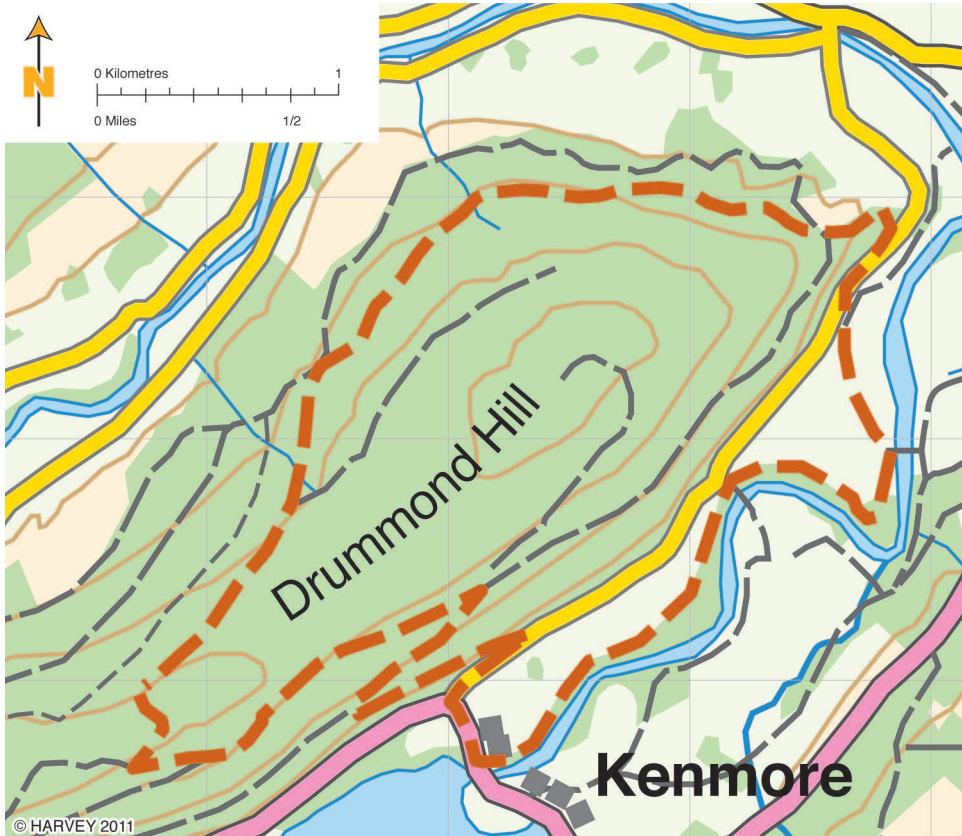
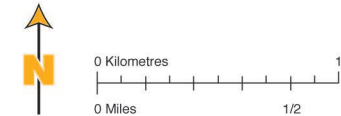


Scottish Mountain Bike Trails: HIGHLAND PERTSHIRE

Initial steep ascent to Black Rock viewpoint, then undulating descent through forest to the picturesque 'gallops' track back to Kenmore.

ROUTE DESCRIPTION

Park at Courtyard Shop and Bar in Kenmore. Turn right out of the Courtyard, then immediately right onto back road, signed Castle Menzies. Pass Kenmore stables on right then turn next left into Drummond Hill Forest trails, passing through car park. Follow track uphill for 200m to T-junction. Turn right and follow track uphill for another 200 metres then turn left until you reach Black Rock viewpoint. Carry on up track taking next right and then next right till you crest the ridge with views to Fortingall and Glen Lyon. Carry on down this track until you reach forest gate. Turn right and follow road for 50 metres, turning left onto old Taymouth Castle 'gallops' opposite cottage. With the river on your left, return to Kenmore with the golf course on your right.

DO THE RIDE THING

We love riding this route and to keep our good relationship with local landowners and other path users we ask you to follow the advice below:

- Let other path users know you are coming as early as possible.
- Please watch your speed especially on blind corners and dips.
- Please take extra care near wildlife and leave the environment as you find it.
- Help land managers and others to work safely and effectively. See 'Route Specifics'.
- The route description and quality of path may change over time so please remain flexible with your plans and be ready to use alternative routes.
- Check the weather forecast and ensure you have all the equipment you need for your route.
- If you are in any doubt please pop into one of our cycle centres for advice!

ROUTE SPECIFICS

- Ground nesting birds please stick to the promoted trail.
- This is a working forest. Please check forest operations at www.forestry.gov.uk/taydistrict before riding route.
